# **BACKGROUND**

- Mr Reuben Brennan, CEO of Red Mako Learning Pty Ltd operates seven coffee shops around Brisbane. The reasoning behind becoming a registered training organisation was to train and develop his 150 staff.
- Training is being conducted in approximately 200 hospitality businesses ranging from small
  independent cafes through to large franchise based chains (e.g. Gloria Jean's Coffees, Coffee
  Club, Zarraffa's, Donut King etc). New franchises include Shingle Inn and various Mexican
  restaurants
- The CEO is passionate about hospitality and also operates a business sales division assisting with selling and financing businesses and equipment within the hospitality industry
- There are no partnerships.
- The organisation consists of a CEO, Compliance Administrator, Head Trainer, Trainers and

- Assessors, Administration Staff and Sales/Marketing personnel.
- The main delivery site is at the head office location located at Unit 12-13/23 Breene Place,
   Morningside but practical assessments are undertaken in various workplaces with agreements in place.
- Mode of delivery is either face to face, distance or through recognition of prior learning.
- For SIT30813 Certificate III in Commercial Cookery the organisation intends to make arrangements with a third party registered training organisation for the delivery of training and assessment for core unit of competency HLTAID004. These arrangements had not been put into place at the time of audit.
- As the organisation has added qualifications onto their scope of registration since the initial audit
  only two student files were able to be viewed as a sampling at time of audit as there has been few
  completions.
- The organisation removed two qualifications (SIR20212 Certificate II in Retail Services and SIR30212 Certificate III in Retail Operations) from scope of registration prior to the audit commencing.

- In the training and assessment strategy it outlines that this unit of competency will be delivered by a third party RTO which will be sourced as required. At audit conflicting information about the delivery of the above qualification was provided to the auditor. The organisations stated that it is now intending to contract a Trainer and Assessor to deliver the core unit *HLTAID003 Provide first aid* and not have a Third Party organisation deliver and assess this unit on its behalf. However, no formal arrangements either way were provided to demonstrate that this is being undertaken. Consequently, the evidence provided did not demonstrate the training and assessment strategy for the above qualification:
  - Is consistent with the requirements of the training product;
  - Provides a framework to guide the learning requirements and the training and assessment arrangements of each training product – the macro level requirements of the learning and assessment process; or that
  - Has been consistently implemented.

The organisations stated that it is now intending to contract a Trainer and Assessor to deliver the core unit HLTAID003 Provide first aid and not have a Third Party organisation deliver and assess this unit on its behalf. However, no formal arrangements either way were provided to demonstrate that this is being undertaken. Consequently, the evidence provided did not demonstrate the amount of training to be provided identified in the strategy for the above qualification is consistent with:
  - o The existing skills, knowledge and experience of learners
  - The mode/s of delivery
  - o The number of units and/or modules being delivered.
- The strategy was not consistent with the AQF volume of learning benchmarks, taking into accounts the above items.
